LETTER FROM PAM

Next Sunday (6th) sees us liturgically move into the "Sundays after Trinity" - Ordinary Time - which stretches until 24th October. It's the longest season of the year church-wise.

However, it is punctuated by what are known as "Festivals; Lesser Festivals and Commemorations". We have two Festivals this week: tomorrow, when we remember the visit of the Blessed Virgin Mary to Elizabeth, and Thursday, which is a Day of Thanksgiving for Holy Communion. Although we remember Jesus instituting the Eucharist at the Last Supper on Maundy Thursday, Holy Week is hardly a time for great celebration: more a time of reflection. Hence the first Thursday after all the post-Easter events was chosen to mark the gift of the Eucharist.

During this week we also remember Justin, Martyr at Rome c.165; Petroc, Abbot of Padstow, 6th century; Boniface(Wynfrith) of Crediton, Bishop, Apostle of Germany, Martyr 754; and the more recent Martyrs of Uganda 1885 -87 and 1977.

Christianity is nothing if not wide-ranging.

This has been NoMowMay - but my lawn will need to be cut before the weekend, as the family are planning on coming - and we can hardly play crazy golf in long grass (the set is lightweight plastic). I'm now looking at a vase of daisies which I picked before the mower gets to work. I've never seen so many red-tipped ones. They're welcome in my garden, and I look forward to them returning in NoMowJune, when I'm hoping they'll be joined by other equally delightful "weeds".
